The office of Clarion County Republican Precinct Committeeperson is up this election cycle. They are considered the grassroots of the party, and determine who leads the local party

What is a Precinct? A precinct is the smallest political unit in the country. Each precinct corresponds to one polling place where the residents of that precinct will go to vote and it is at the precinct level where elections are won or lost. Most importantly, the precinct is YOUR neighborhood. You know the people, the schools, and the community centers. You understand the problems, can relate to the concerns, and have a desire to improve your neighborhood and precinct!

The precinct is the most important voting and organizational unit within Republican Party! Do not underestimate the value and importance of the Precinct Committee Person. It is these committee persons actively working with the Republican Party who win elections at the local, state, and national level. A committee person is an elected official of the Republican Party. Each voting precinct can have up to **two** committee people elected by the Republican voters of that precinct every four years and there are **40** voting precincts in Clarion County.

With the importance of the upcoming 2020 elections the Clarion County Republican Committee desires to insure that every voting precinct is represented with Committeepersons.

Getting on the ballot and becoming a Precinct Committeeperson.

Precinct Committeepersons are elected in gubernatorial election years on the Primary election ballot. To get on the ballot to become a PC, please follow these steps:

- 1. Be a registered Republican voter!
- 2. Reside in the precinct for which you are running.
- **3**. Pick up a petition and packet from the Elections Office in the Clarion County Administrative Building, 330 Main Street, Clarion, PA or the Clarion County Republican Committee will also provide these materials for you.
- **4**. Gather the required number of signatures from registered Republican voters in your precinct (typically 10+) on your petition during the petition period. It is recommended getting at least double the number of signatures required. The petition period is Tuesday, Jan 28, 2020 until Tuesday, Feb 18, 2020.
- **5**. File the petition with the Elections Office in the Clarion County Administrative Building, 330 Main Street, Clarion, PA on or before Tuesday, Feb 18, 2020.
